

Dear Jake,

It was good to talk to you. I look forward to having Justin and the trailer at the horse trials. The spring event is April 16-17 and we would like to have you participate in the Trade Fair. As we do not charge a fee, we ask that you participate in the awards program. I suggest that you contribute one set of shoes (4) with stud inserts and one set of medium studs to each division. We anticipate 10 to 12 divisions.

With regard to my use of the shoes, following has been my experience:

WILLIE (Whiskey River) is a 28 year old "retired" Advanced level event horse. He competed at Rolex several times, and was on the 1991 Pan American team. Over the last year, he has become uncomfortable, and not too rideable. Three months ago my farrier put **easywalkers** on him. Since then he is back to running off with me and jumping all the coups and rails in the foundation! I have to say to him "Willie, you think that you are 17 again! (He was still running Advanced at that age)

REMYNGTON is my current American Warmblood (Quarter Horse), 7 years old, 17 hands, 1450 pounds. He is at Training level, and wins his share. He has absolutely no problems, but due to his lineage, and size, I am concerned that he may in the future. I put **easywalkers**, all around with stud inserts, and will put everything to the test next month in Florida. (This past Sunday, he was first place, at a local dressage show)

I look forward to our future relationship.
