I bought her 5 years ago, complete with wear and tear (some arthritis, and bone spurs) and much of her history unknown.

Being a hunter jumper rider, my emphasis has shifted now to more flat work (dressage), and some light jumping in order to keep her comfortable and sound. I turned to **easywalker** horse shoes in an effort to try and find a lighter shoe with more comfort, protection, and shock absorption and more support to her joints as she grows older. Without exaggeration, I have never had a more comfortable ride as I do now. I have a happier, more supple horse that goes from a canter on a trail ride to a collected canter in a ring. The added bonus was that much to my surprise she grew heel and no longer needed wedge pads, something I hadn't even thought about. She feels like a younger horse, and I only wish I knew about **easywalker** years ago..
